Role of the parent rep

To increase & improve communication between school and parent group

- Passing on messages, requests
- Being confident to contact school for clarification of matters and sharing with class group
- Offering constructive challenge or feedback on curriculum or organisation
- Referring individuals to the school leaders / signposting support
- Asking questions building cohesion

Purpose of half termly meetings

- For the school to talk about priorities, events and activities for the coming term
- To consult on particular policies or to present these
- To share key messages
- To share feedback and look for solutions
- To create a community of support

- Understand that for new routines to become habits, they require practice, mistakes, repetition and +ve outlook;
 spread this message ;-)

Communication - who to talk to

- Call or email the relevant school office ask for the teacher to contact you
- In most cases this will happen within 24hrs
- For most matters speak first to the teacher
- If a matter is then not solved, refer to our Heads of School who may communicate with you directly or pass it to the most appropriate leader.
- If an SEN matter -speak to our SENCos
- Understand that we listen even if it means we dont change our policies and ways of working immediately, a little or at all. Who to talk to
