- black low heeled plain school shoes/ entirely black trainers. no colourful trainers or any with markings, branding.



- The school is using White Rose Maths for our maths curriculum.
- Mastery works on the belief that <u>all children</u> can achieve in maths.
- Children work in mixed ability groupings on the same lesson content at the same time until the concept is mastered. Progression is about going deeper rather than moving onto the next concept. Bigger numbers aren't always harder.
- Children are encouraged to question, explore, reason, problem solve and prove their thinking – demonstrating flexibility of knowledge.
- CPA approach- **concrete** (using manipulatives), **pictorial** (picture-based/visual representations), **abstract** (numbers and symbols)



They will:

- Work on fluency and arithmetic with quizzes to help build speed and confidence in maths.
- Continue their knowledge of reasoning and being able to know and explain 'why' and 'how' they know something. These can be the most challenging concepts of maths,
- Encourage this way of thinking by asking 'how do you know that?'


END OF YEAR EXPECTATIONS

- Throughout the year we track your child's progress. This is recorded through termly pupil progress meetings with class teachers and the senior leadership team. Judgements are based on a combination of book looks, ongoing teacher observations and end of term assessments.
- At the end of the school year, we report on whether your child is working at
 (WA) the expected standard in the core curriculum areas.
- There will be some children who demonstrate a greater depth of knowledge. We report that they are working at **greater depth (GD)**.
- For those children who have not yet met the standard we report that they are working towards (WT) the standard.

HOMEWORK

- We will be sending home weekly spellings lists.
- These will be a set of words such as the common exception words for year 1.

 Each week, we will have quizzes in class to monitor and embed the spellings.






- We will be continuing with Read Write inc phonics and we will be transitioning into guided reading sessions.
- Children will continue to bring home reading material each week.
 Some of which is to be read to or with the child and some of which is the child's ditty. This will be repeatedly read until changed.

 Practice is a key strategy we use to enable children to memorise concepts and build their knowledge.
- There is a letter with more information going out shortly. There will be lots of training opportunities available too.



PHONICS ASSESSMENT

- The phonics screening check usually takes place in Year 1 but due to the interruptions of recent years, we will be conducting the assessment this term.
- The check consists of 20 real words and 20 pseudowords (alien words) that a pupil must sound out and blend to read aloud to the teacher.
- The phonics screening is designed to confirm whether pupils have learnt phonic decoding to the expected standard.
- It will identify pupils who needs extra help to improve their decoding skills.
