## THE CURRICULUM

- Throughout the year, the children will be working towards meeting the Year 2 expectations. Our curriculum is designed to stimulate the children's creativity, foster a love of learning and develop their imagination.
- It also covers all the statutory learning objectives set out in the National Curriculum.
- There is more information on the <u>website</u>.
- <u>MHFS New Curriculum</u> was created by teachers to develop skills and knowledge deeply across the curriculum. This is going to be continued as they move through MHFS. We are constantly reviewing, reflecting and adapting as we teach the content.

We will learn about things such as adaptability, habitats, microhabitats.

Whoever isn't swimming has an extra PE lesson each week.

This is depending on restrictions and risk assessment at the time.





- The school are using White Rose Maths for our maths curriculum.
- Mastery works on the belief that **<u>all children</u>** can achieve in maths.
- Children work in mixed ability groupings on the same lesson content at the same time until the concept is mastered. Progression is about going deeper rather than moving onto the next concept. Bigger numbers aren't always harder.
- Children are encouraged to **question**, **explore**, **reason**, **problem solve** and **prove** their thinking demonstrating flexibility of knowledge.
- CPA approach- **concrete** (using manipulatives), **pictorial** (picturebased/visual representations), **abstract** (numbers and symbols)



- We will be building on their learning from reception and year 1.
- They will be using their knowledge of **tens and ones** and their **number bonds** to 10 and 20 to help apply this to larger numbers.
- It is important they are secure in their maths working within 20 to be able to take this next step.
- They will also continue developing their understanding of shape, measure and money.



They will:

- Begin learning our **2s, 5s and 10s times tables** by building on their learning of skip counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.
- Work on **fluency** and **arithmetic** with quizzes to help build speed and confidence in maths.
- Continue their knowledge of reasoning and being able to know and explain 'why' and 'how' they know something. These can be the most challenging concepts of maths,

Encourage this way of thinking by asking 'how do you know that?'

## END OF YEAR EXPECTATIONS

- Throughout the year we track your child's progress. This is recorded through termly pupil progress meetings with class teachers and the senior leadership team. Judgements are based on a combination of book looks,ongoing teacher observations and end of term assessments.
- At the end of the school year, we report on whether your child is working at (WA) the expected standard in the core curriculum areas.
- There will be some children who demonstrate a greater depth of knowledge. We report that they are working at **greater depth (GD)**.
- For those children who have not yet met the standard we report that they are **working towards (WT)** the standard.

## HOMEWORK

- We will be sending home **weekly spellings** lists (starting next week).
- These will be a set of words such as the common exception words for year 2.
- Each week, we will have quizzes in class to monitor and embed the spellings.
- We will be working on more after half term including times tables revision.
- Children should be reading for **at least** 15 minutes every day.

# KNOWLEDGE ORGANISERS

- We will be sending home knowledge organisers. These summarise the learning that our curriculum covers and what the children will be learning in some of their lessons.
- You can use these at home to discuss your child's learning together.





- We will be continuing with Read Write inc phonics and we will be transitioning into reading sessions.
- Children will continue to bring home reading material each week. Some of which is to be read to or with the child and some of which is the child's ditty. This will be <u>repeatedly</u> read until changed. Practice is a key strategy we use to enable children to memorise concepts and build their knowledge.





- This year, we are asking for the children to bring their book bags to school and home again every day.
- This is so they can bring their snack as well as take home anything that they need to.
- Children should not bring any additional bags such as backpacks unless it is for swimming.
- Children should write a comment in their reading diary about their reading books once but they should still read them every day.
- The books should be returned on **Wednesday.** We will be giving new books on **Thursday.** Each child will bring home 3 books. One of which will be a free choice book.
