School Times

- School opens at 8:50am with children needing to be in class before 9:00am.
- After 9:00am, children are recorded as late.
- The school day ends at **3:20pm**.



End of the Day 1H and 1RW

- The children are dismissed from the double doors by the hall (access through school driveway). Children will only be dismissed when teachers see the child's parents/carers and calls their name.
- Children attending playcentre and clubs will be collected by a member of their staff.
- If your child is being collected by someone other than you, they will need to give the teacher the password (from the school office) for the child to be released.
- If you need to speak to your child's teacher, please wait until all children have been dismissed.



End of the Day 1K and 1F

- The children can be collected from the shelter in the infant playground. Children will only be dismissed when teachers see the child's parents/carers and calls their name.
- Children attending playcentre and clubs will be collected by a member of their staff.
- If your child is being collected by someone other than you, they will need to give the teacher the password (from the school office) for the child to be released.
- If you need to speak to your child's teacher, please wait until all children have been dismissed.



Absences

- Please call or email school before **8:30am** to report child absence.
- You must state what is wrong as we have a duty of care to you, other children, staff and the whole school community.
- Appointments should be made out of school time. If this is not possible, please let the office know in advance. Children must be collected and dropped off by an adult to be signed in/out.
- If you need to request a period of absence, write a letter/email of request addressed to **Ms Dyson, Head of Schools**.

Read Write Inc

- The children have been assessed and are working at the level that will challenge them and allow them to learn at their own pace.
- The children will be in a class with a known adult for their Read Write Inc (RWI) group.
- The children will learn new sounds, they will learn spellings of words with these sounds as well as high frequency (tricky) words, and they will apply this in their writing.
- They will be reading a book throughout the week and a copy of this will also be sent home to be practised at home.
- The expectation is that an adult reads with their child each day. Please write the name of the book in the reading record and comment at least once a week.
- The children are only issued with a new book (once a week) when their old book has been returned. Any lost book will be charged at £6 per book using PING.
- Please make sure your child returns their book on time. **Every Friday.**

Numbots





- All of the children have a numbots account.
- The details were shared on tapestry last year
- These details will be shared again.
- Children are to 'play' for about 10 minutes each day to build their basic maths skills
- Children are awarded certificates for achieving goals
- Classes are awarded for the most children who participate



Three Trusted Adults

• We encourage all children to identify 3 adults in school who they feel comfortable and safe to go to with a problem.
