# Year 3 Curriculum



## Our Year 3 Curriculum - Autumn 1



Big Question	A black question mark inside a white circle.	How has Finchley changed over time? This big question has centred our learning into our local area to allow the students to develop an understanding of the area around us through building skills in different areas of our curriculum.
Maths	A black calculator icon.	To further strengthen the foundation of our children's Mathematics knowledge we will be building upon skills of place value, addition and subtraction.
English	A black pencil icon.	Students will be focusing on developing a strong understanding of the structure of a sentence by exploring the different grammatical parts of the sentence and how they work together.
History	An icon of an open book with pages.	In History we are looking into the past of our local area. The children will be developing skills to analyse sources and compare them to their view of the present to understand the sequence of time.
Science	A green flask icon with a green liquid inside.	To begin we will be laying the foundation of the Scientific method through engaging in experiments that light the spark of investigation and later this term we will be exploring what plants need to grow.
Religious Education	An icon of an open book with pages.	Our area is diverse in faiths which are followed by the members of our community. This half term will introduce children to Christianity, they will learn about the origin, symbols and beliefs of this religion.
PSHE	A simple black and white smiley face icon.	Our focus of this half terms circle times and PSHE lessons will be to make the transition to the junior school and back to school after a long break as comfortable and supportive for our young learners.
Music	An icon of musical notes on a staff.	Our brilliant Music teachers will be introducing the musical families of the orchestra to our Year 3, exploring their unique sounds and roles. The children will get the opportunity to ...
Computing	An icon of a computer monitor.	Our Year 3 children will be introduced to using the Chromebooks and will be developing coding skills through using scratch to create their own unique animation.
French	The flag of France, with vertical stripes of blue, white, and red.	Bonjour! We will be starting to learn basic phrases, questions, colours and learning numbers to 10.

# School Times

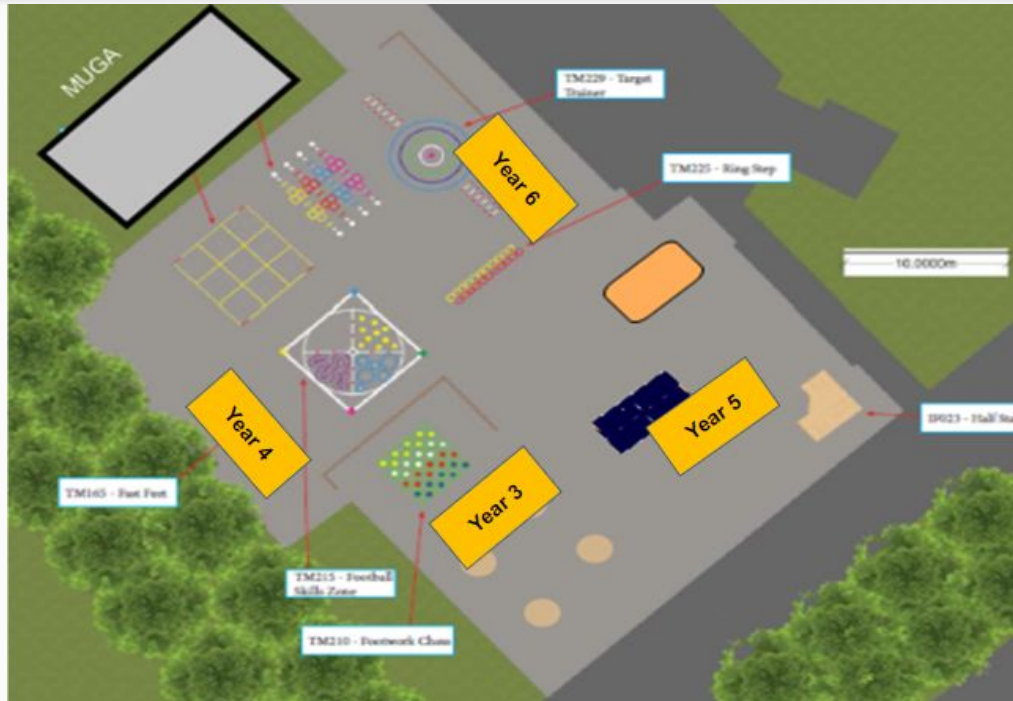
- School opens at **8:40am** for children to begin early morning learning.
- The bell is rung at **8:50am** with children needing to be in class before **9:00am**.
- After 9:00am, children are recorded as late.
- The school day ends at **3:20pm**.



# End of the Day

- The children are taken to the playground and can be collected from there. Children will only be dismissed when teachers see the child's parents/carers.
- If your child meets you at Moss Hall Grove, you need to inform school. Children will then be escorted to Moss Hall Grove (infant shuttle) to meet you there.
- Children attending playcentre will be met in the playground by a member of their staff.
- Children attending a club will meet their leader at the club location.
- If you wish your child to be an independent traveller, please complete a form from the office and the school will discuss this with you.

# Absences

- Please call or email school before **8:30am** to report child absence.

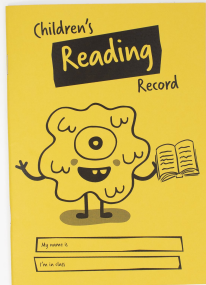

# Accelerated Reader



- Assists children in choosing books and reading texts that are suitable for them and that will develop their reading fluency and key reading skills.
- Each child should be reading daily at home
- They should bring their book in daily for school reading
- Once your child has completed a book, they need to complete the quiz linked to the book online, as soon as possible.
- Children will be able to change their books during their library sessions

*An Accelerated Reader workshop will be run for Year 3 parents in a few weeks.*

# Five Trusted Adults

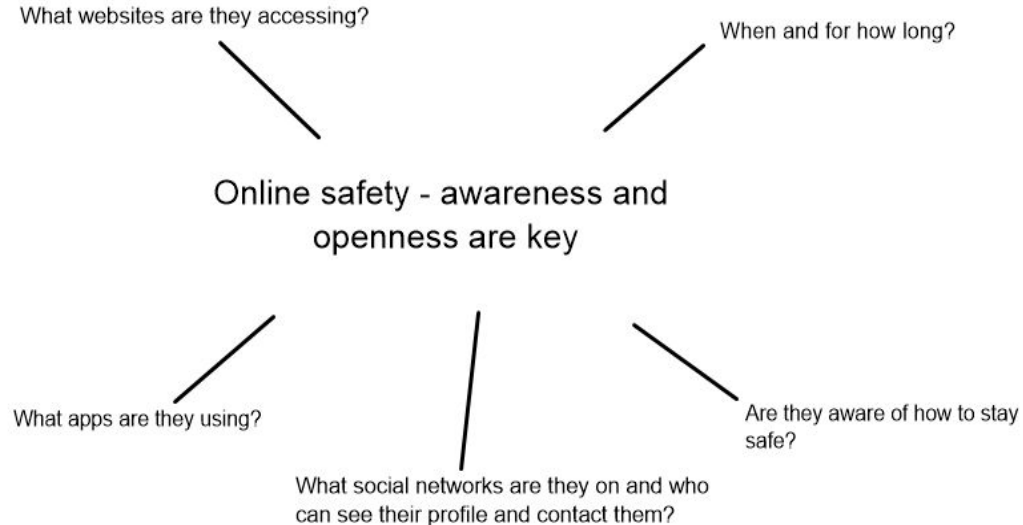
- We encourage all children to identify 5 adults in school who they feel comfortable and safe to go to with a problem
