

- School opens at **8:40am** for children to begin early morning learning.
- The bell is rung at 8:50am with children needing to be in class before 9:00am.
- After 9:00am, children are recorded as late.
- The school day ends at 3:20pm.

Punctuality and high attendance at school so important for each pupil!

Arriving on time enables all pupils to 'ready' themselves for learning. This helps them take responsibility for their learning, develops their resilience and maturity and more.



### Absences

- Please call or email school before **8:30am** to report child absence.
- You must state what is wrong as we have a duty of care to you, other children, staff and the whole school community.
- Appointments should be made out of school time. If this is not possible, please let the office know in advance. Children must be collected and dropped off by an adult to be signed in/out.
- If you need to request a period of absence, write a letter/email of request addressed to **Ms Dyson, Head of School**.



# End of the Day

- The children are taken to the playground and can be collected from there. Children will only be dismissed when teachers see the child's parents/carers.
- If your child meets you at Moss Hall Grove, you need to inform school. Children will then be escorted to Moss Hall Grove (infant shuttle) to meet you there.
- Children attending playcentre will be met in the playground by a member of their staff.
- Children attending a club will meet their leader at the club location.
- If you wish your child to be an independent traveller, please complete a form from the office and the school will discuss this with you.

### End of the day pick up





Parents to walk to their collection points and children collected from this area. This will give parents chance to see teachers more closely should they want to. **Children can still** use the shuttle.

#### **School Lunches**



- The Pantry are our school lunch provider
- You must set up a Pantry account where you can pre order your child's meal (before 9am on the day).
- Primary school children in state-funded schools in London will get free school meals for the 2023/24 school year. The Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan is providing the funding as an emergency cost of living support measure.
- If your child is absent from school, you need to cancel the meal before 9am to avoid food being wasted

### Behaviour

- Children are expected to be ready, respectful and responsible.
- We record behaviour on Track It using 4 colours: green, orange, yellow and red
- House points are tracked as green
- Pupils receive certificates when they have gained a certain amount of house points
- House winners are rewarded termly





# Home Learning

- Mental arithmetic practice daily in home learning books
- Spelling daily in home learning books

- Knowledge organiser revision to support learning in the classroom
- Sometimes a project will be sent home

### **Accelerated Reader**



- Assists children in choosing books and reading texts that are suitable for them and that will develop their reading fluency and key reading skills.
- Each child should be reading daily at home
- They should bring their book in daily for school reading
- Once your child has completed a book, they need to complete the quiz linked to the book online, as soon as possible.
- Children will be able to change their books during their library sessions





- External (paid) clubs for the autumn term are currently full
- New applications will be available in December for the spring term.
- Ms Scantlebury manages the clubs but you can find information and apply via the school website
- Internal clubs run by school staff will be advertised internally
- Music lessons are provided by BEAT. We organise timetables, however any other problems must be taken up with them https://beatrust.org.uk/contact/



# **Five Trusted Adults**

• We encourage all children to identify 5 adults in school who they feel comfortable and safe to go to with a problem

- In classrooms there is also an 'Ask it Basket'
- If pupils want to express their feelings, concerns, worries, etc. they can write it on a note and 'post it'.
- These are read by teachers and managed how needed.
